- Volunteers helped produce 209,000 high protein meals for North and South Carolina and Florida during hurricane relief efforts.
- 167 Hope Buckets[™] were filled with LuminAID[™] solar lanterns, hygiene supplies, first aid kits, brand new Bombas socks, and other critical items like diapers and baby formula.
- 1,008 cases of Promise Water™, 648 pairs of brand new shoes, and 8 pallets of new blankets were also provided.





- In 2018, volunteers packed 17,124
 Hope Boxes™ with high protein food,
 water purification supplies, and the
 Good News.
- A Child's Hope Int'l (ACHI) partnered with UPS and the USAF to deliver over 46 tons of life-saving Hope Boxes™ to orphans and vulnerable children of Haiti.



- On World Water Day in April, ACHI launched its newest endeavor, Promise Water[™] (PW), that promises to deliver one million gallons of clean drinking water to thirsty children every year.
- Businesses, churches, sports teams, and schools have joined the movement to bring clean water to children around the world by supporting PW. Couples even used PW at their weddings as they made their own "promises" to have and to hold...
- Alpine Valley Pure Service has agreed to offer home and office delivery of PW.
- Through the sale of 4,300 cases of PW plus donations, this program partnered with the P&G Children's Safe Drinking Water Program in 2018 to produce over 1.5 million gallons of clean drinking water!
- Restoration Park Church sold over 1,100 cases of Promise Water during their Christmas sermon series.



- In 2018, Hands Against Hunger[™] volunteers produced 275 tons of high protein meals that were all packed by hand.
- 19 Public Sessions, 33 Special Sessions, and 5 Mobile Sessions were conducted that produced over 17,124 Hope Boxes™ containing 3.7M high protein meals, supplies to purify 1.7M gallons of water, and over 50K copies of Challenge™.
- Nearly 12K guests attended these packing events, with many sold out at 400+ registrants.
- Six different countries were served: Swaziland, Haiti, Ukraine, Guatemala, Lone Togo, and USA.
- Sack Hunger was sponsored at Sam's Club where the community donated over 9 tons of rice for the impoverished children in Cincinnati.
- 15 tons of high protein meals were donated for local families throughout the Cincinnati area, as well as KY and TN.
- Over 10,000 orphans and vulnerable children are receiving Hands Against Hunger[™] food, clean drinking water, and life giving hope every day.



- 100% of funds from royalties and sales of *Journey to the Fatherless*™ help families with adoption expenses.
- Nearly \$5,000 was added to the ACHI Adoption Fund through JTF sales and royalties.



- Throughout 2018, we focused our attention and gifts on a group of 100 children that were forced to flee their orphanage in South Sudan in the middle of the night and seek refuge in Uganda.
- Funds from the 2017 Cincinnati Gives campaign, along with new donations from the 2018 Perfect Christmas Gift campaign, have allowed ACHI to provide safe shelter, a solar-powered fresh water well, Hope Boxes™, a portable ultrasound machine, and various other essential supplies for the orphans in Uganda.



- ACHI is certified by CFC for federal government workers to have a payroll contribution sent to a charity of their choosing.
- In 2018, CFC employees donated \$13K from 40 different regions across the USA.

- ◆ 2018 was the third year for the Hope Prison Ministry at an Ohio state prison. Five prison events were attended by 150 inmates who produced 21,384 Hands Against Hunger™ high protein meals for indigent children.
- Inmates earn the right to attend these special packing events where the Good News is presented. Some of these men are incarcerated for a very long time, yet these opportunities give them the restoring hope of giving back.



- The Alleen Company invited Hands Against Hunger™ to participate in Holiday in Lights for the 8th consecutive year.
- This event was very successful with over \$25K being raised.



- ◆ ACHI's 10 Year Celebration was a home run!
- Over 400 guests from the West Coast to the East Coast, and even across the Atlantic, joined us in celebrating ACHI's first ten years at the Oasis Conference Center in Loveland, OH.
- The Children of the World Choir blessed us with an inspiring performance that had us talking about it long after the event.
- Our featured speaker, Vernon Brewer, President and Founder of World Help, gave a powerful message about a hope that can change the world.
- We had a fundraising goal of \$250,000 that would go towards the establishment of Hope Factory 2 in the Dayton region. As a result of the generous giving of all our supporters, we came very close to that goal with a total of \$213,470!!
